


St Joseph's school


This week our school has been hearing about the devastating floods in Queensland and throughout the NSW east coast. Our 4/5/6 class have created

Barraba Show roundup 2022

There were many highlights at this year's show and one of them was the Xtreme Bronc ride on Friday night that attracted many excited spectators to see the cream of the crop in bronc riding take part. One of the major sponsors for this event was the NSW Government with funding for a 2022 Country Shows Support Package aimed at helping agricultural shows bounce back from the hardships of the past 4 years.

Prize money for the Open Six Bar jumping event was also provided from this package, helping to attract more competitors and bring increased number of spectators to our show and the Barraba community. The grandstand was full and many more watched from the grass area while this event was in action.





The Aboriginal families of Barraba

On Sunday morning 13 March,

Nandewar Historical Society members gathered at the Barraba Museum for a talk and discussion led by Brad Sutherland from Tamworth. Brad was accompanied by his wife Debbie, granddaughter Tamara, and uncle Paul White from Manilla.

Brad and his family had a wealth of information, showing Museum members many books and records about aboriginal families that, since white settlement, have passed through and have settled in the Barraba district.

A really interesting few hours; the Museum hopes to develop a permanent display of local Aboriginal history.

History Notes

A busy few days for members this week with the markets and some interesting visitors on Sunday, and this is meeting week as well. The markets went off well on Saturday- just a couple less stalls than usual and a steady stream of visitors visiting the stalls and having a rest on the terrace at the back of the museum. Just one visitor to the museum was perhaps a little disappointing.

Sunday's meeting with visitors from Tamworth, who came to talk about our aboriginal residents in the past, was most interesting. The puzzle re a woman from Quirindi with a selection of names has been solved with an official certificate-a great relief to those who have been on the trail for some time.

There has been a request re Dick Smith, who was a resident of Cobbadah, and who is buried there. He is in the back section of the Cobbadah Book published by the historical society in 1975. Apparently, he was an orphan left on a doorstep in Victoria somewhere and Barraba's local solicitor, J. B. Ryan, was unable to find out any more than that when Dick made his will at retirement age. He is the only person buried in the Cobbadah Cemetery.

Another personality of the Cobbadah area was Harry Bushell. He was the son of a maintenance man and grew up with his family in a bark hut on Duncombe's selection near Cobbadah. Harry worked on the property "Ouyan" for 33 years earning himself the reputation for reliability- the society has a photo of him doing just that.

He retired to Cobbadah, living in a little hut in the village and it is described in Betty Crowley's book in great detail but has since disappeared. He enjoyed reading the paper particularly the horse racing in the Sydney Mail. Fred Randall was a close friend to Harry and the pair spent many hours together.

Harry Bushell died on 20th October, 1955 at the age of 78 years and is buried in Barraba. Fred Randall died just two years later and is also buried in Barraba.

This book also contains some information on Joseph Johnson, who was an early settler in the village and Charlie Robinson who had an interesting past history before settling in the area.

Charlie White, hotel keeper, at Cobbadah, was a bit of a poet as well as "Mine Host" and wrote a few lines known as "The Joke that Misfired" about his kitchen maid who was being courted by three local men. It seems the School Master won her heart in the end.

Last week Kevin Anderson told Barraba Rugby officials that they were successful in gaining a 'Stronger Communities Grant' for \$678073 for upgrading facilities at the Rugby Club.

One of the main items to be addressed will be the new change rooms for female players which will allow them to get ready in their own quarters instead of sharing with the men, with specific times for use so they don't clash.

Other improvements to take place will include a First Aid room, store room, referees change room, rumpus room for the young ones and more space in the Club area. The Clubhouse has been used and hired for several functions over the years and should prove to be more accessible to many more organisations on the completion of the work.

The grounds and the facilities have been used by the schools for carnivals, football, cross country, with junior cricket and junior rugby (one of the biggest carnivals in the north) touch football, senior cricket and Central North rugby training camps. So, with the additions, all these sports bodies will have better facilities available. Training is going well on Tuesday nights with reasonably good numbers attending. The first game is on April 9th in Narrabri followed by a bye weekend over Easter.


