Renewal of historic town clocks at Manilla and Barraba

Renewal of the historic town clocks at Manilla and Barraba has commenced this week and will take 3-4 weeks to complete.

Both town clocks have been losing time in recent years due to their internal master clocks finally reaching end of their life after decades of reliable service.

Manilla's clock is the only one of its kind known to remain in use within NSW, and Barraba's town clock dates back to 1924.

While the external look of these historic town clocks will remain the same, the internal master clocks will be replaced by 4 independent GPS controlled intelligent clock mechanisms and a GPS antenna.

The use of separate mechanisms requires modification of the hands, however the existing hands will be retained to maintain the aesthetic appearance of the historic clocks. The mechanisms will self-synchronise with the GPS and reset following any power interruption as well as adjust automatically for daylight savings.



The staff of Richardson House are very excited this week as we commence our implementation of the electronic medication management system MedSig which has been made possible through a successful application for a Grant offered through the Federal Government.

This system connects the facility, the pharmacy and the prescribing Doctors allowing prescriptions and changes to be immediately sent to the pharmacy for dispensing, while also instantly updating the Resident Medication system at Richardson House.

Systems such as these help staff to ensure that all Residents receive correct medications, allow for timely adjustments and changes to be made when necessary, as well as assisting with communications between the facility, the pharmacy and the prescribing Doctors.

We would like to thank the lovely staff from Webstercare, Sarah, Kelly and Narelle for coming to Richardson House to provide training and to our wonderful staff for embracing these changes head on with a positive and can do attitude. Thanks also to the Barraba Caremore Pharmacy staff for their assistance with this implementation as we could not have introduced this quality improvement without their cooperation.

History Notes

The ambulance photo in last week's news immediately attracted my

attention as I saw Bill Randall standing on the far right of the photo. The two men beside the vehicle I am not so sure of but could be Bruce Smith and Butch Butler — no doubt someone will be sure of their names. One thing for sure is the Ambulance station has been built as the car is standing on the driveway.

Records of the ambulance in Barraba before amalgamation are held by the Society but have not seen the light of day for some years. When they first came to the museum I began typing them up and then they were recalled by Tamworth Ambulance for recording. They came back to the museum but I had gone onto recording another subject at that time – 1944 to 1966 are recorded in the folder at this stage. Some of the headlines are:-

Towards the end of 1948 after a meeting of concerned citizens, enquiries were made re the cost of an ambulance. A suitable sedan type car was preferred and then a conversion to handle 2 stretchers. Subscriptions 10/- per year were called for.

Early in 1949 a Pontiac sedan was ordered from Cliftons Pty Ltd but they were unable to supply the car later in the year. Tenders were then called for from GR White, Harry White & Co and Roy Collins & Co. A Dodge vehicle was delivered early in 1951 and housed in GR White's iron shed in Alice Street. I wonder does anyone know where that shed was? By the end of 1951 it seems the ambulance was moved to Clifton's Garage.

As the 1950's passed, the meetings show a movement to find a permanent driver to live in town. There were members looking for a suitable home for both the ambulance and the driver and they considered a block of land near the Memorial Hall after the storage depot in the Scout Hall was broken into.

A new ambulance was purchased late in 1959 and lan McGuffog became the first station officer in March, 1960. As the photo shows the driveway of the new ambulance station I would think it would be sometime in the 1960s – we just need to find the correct newspaper. (see Graham Down's letter below-Ed)

There are lots more pages re the 1960s and may reveal when the station was actually built but it is rather time consuming and on Monday morning I just do not have the time. There will be more next week together with the results from the meeting this week.

Letter to Editor

Hi Brian,

Today's Barraba Community News (Wednesday, 15 March, 2023) is a photo of an Ambulance and a call to Brains Trust to identify a photo found at the Barraba Ambulance Station. I think I can throw some light on the photo.

I took over as the Treasurer of the Barraba Branch of the Tamworth Ambulance Service from Ken Stanton late in 1955. Our son, Colin, was born 15 September 1955 and shortly after he was born in Barraba we used the Barraba ambulance to transfer Colin to Tamworth because of breathing problems. The President of the Barraba Branch at that time was Terry Kelly. The Barraba Branch committee worked hard to raise funds to build a new Ambulance Station in Barraba. We ran barbecues at the New Year's Horton Rodeos and many other functions. In the end we funded the new station. The first Ambulance Officer at the Station was Ian James McGuffog. Ian was newly married and at that time I thought what start, a career, newly married, new station and we bought two new ambulances. Ian's marriage to Patricia Catharine Noon was registered 27740/1957. So, if the marriage was 1957 the photo would in 1957. and the photo probably is Terry Kelly handing over the keys to the new Chrysler ambulance to Ian McGuffog at the new Barraba Station.

If the Ambulance in the photo is a Chrysler then there is a story. As I have said the Barraba Station was a branch of the Tamworh Ambulance Service with Superintendent Eric Hermanson in charge. When Eric found out we had purchased a Chrysler (the Barraba branch supporting Roy Collins, the Chrysler dealer in Barraba and had it fitted out by Grice (Grice fitted the bodies to all NSW ambulances at that time) in Sydney there was an uproar as Eric was trying to comply to have a standard fleet of ambulances with uniform make and body.

Many years later I spoke to Ian at a large fun run in Sydney. I had been invited to start the race and Ian was there in an official ambulance role. He had risen to a senior position in the Ambulance Service.

Brian, I think the above may be link to the photo.

NSW STATE ELECTIONS THIS SATURDAY

It is four years since the last NSW state election. **Voting day is this Saturday 25 March.** Voting is compulsory for every Australian citizen over 18 years. In Barraba, the Polling Place will be, as usual, the Bicentennial Hall, open from 8am to 6pm.

When you go to vote, you will be given instructions as to how to record a valid vote. For this election, you only need to mark a "1" against your preferred candidate.

 Electing 21 Members of the 42 seat Legislative Council (the Upper House). There is no local candidate – every member of the Legislative Council theoretically covers the whole of NSW. There are literally hundreds of candidates on the ballot paper. Again, the ballot paper has instructions on how to record a valid vote.

EARLY VOTING

If you are travelling away from home on Saturday, you can vote absentee at any Polling Place in NSW. If you are in the Tamworth Electorate, but unable to get to a Polling Place on Saturday (because you are working etc), you can vote early at one of the early voting centres in our electorate. COMMENT

Over the past few months there has been overwhelming coverage on TV, radio, papers and social media discussing the election, the issues, and the personalities. So often the question is put; will you vote for Dominic Perrottet (leader of the Liberal Party and current Premier) or Chris Minns (leader of the Labor Party)?

All that carry on is very misleading. In our Parliamentary system, we cannot vote for the Premier. We vote for our local representative, one of 93 Members of the Legislative Assembly. When the votes are all counted and 93 Members assemble in the NSW Parliament, the Party or group that has a majority (that is 47 seats or more) becomes the Government. Those Members elect their Leader who then becomes Premier, barring accidents, for the next four years. It is NOT like the American system, where the people elect the President.

ARCHIVES ON TOUR comes to *Tamworth*Lord Carrington is coming to town!







One of the jewels of the State Archives Collection, a selection of volumes of the exquisitely handcrafted Carrington Albums, is making its way around regional NSW - offering visitors a chance to step back in time to an era full of pomp and ceremony.

Dated from 1885, The Carrington Albums are a series of 14 leather bound volumes of illuminated addresses, each one gifted to Lord and Lady Carrington from the regional communities they visited throughout their 5 year term as Vice Regals.

A sign of affection from the people and a memento of the Governor's visit, the addresses are beautiful artworks, with finely detailed illuminated borders, hand painted illustrations, greetings and well-wishes.

The addresses, representing hundreds of residents, towns and associations, were later bound together into the Carrington Albums and presented to Lord Carrington at the end of his term in 1890. He took the Albums back to the England where they remained with the Carrington family for many years.

Given the significance of the albums to the state of NSW, the volumes were repatriated to the NSW Government in 2014 to be cared for in the State Archives Collection.

The NSW State Archives Collection documents the daily work of the NSW Government and its agencies from 1788 to today. This vast collection records history as it happens, providing valuable and at times, life-changing evidence of events and decisions that have shaped and continue to shape our history, communities, and lives.



MOBILE DIALYSIS UNITS TO DELIVER LIFE-SAVING PATIENT CARE IN THE REGION

A re-elected NSW Liberal and Nationals Government will invest \$15.6 million to roll out six new state-of-the-art mobile dialysis buses across rural and regional NSW, which will see dialysis services boosted in the Tamworth electorate.

Member for Tamworth Kevin Anderson said the commitment would ensure patients can get the care they need as close as possible to home. "Chronic kidney disease is incredibly demanding on patients and their families who need to travel to access frequent treatment," Mr Anderson said. "Patients may need to travel to Tamworth three to five times a week to receive treatment which means hours on the road every week for patients living in our regional towns. Getting a mobile dialysis bus on the road in the Tamworth electorate will make life so much easier for patients and their families while cutting the cost of accessing treatment."

Minister for Regional Health Bronnie Taylor said establishing mobile dialysis services will mean for weeks at a time people will be able to receive treatment in their local community. "These buses will be fitted out with dialysis machines and comfortable chairs for patients to receive the care they need, and will be staffed with specialist nurses," Mrs Taylor said.

As part of this commitment, four state-of-the-art mobile dialysis units will be built, and will operate right across regional NSW including parts of Western NSW, across the Riverina and Murray, Southern NSW, the Upper Hunter and the Northern Tablelands.



The \$149.5 million expansion of the scheme means eligible patients are now receiving almost double the subsidy towards accommodation costs and private vehicle use where they travel more than 100 kilometres for care. In the first six months of the expanded scheme, 1,166 patients in the Tamworth electorate received \$620,375.64 in financial support.
